DIVECON RATING

The SSI Dive Control Specialist (DiveCon) rating stands alone as the premier dive leader rating in the industry. No other course offers the training, experience and opportunities included with this course. Successful completion of the DiveCon course denotes a high level of achievement and professionalism.

PREREQUISITES

- Before applying to the DiveCon Training program, candidates must:
- Be at least 18 years old.
- Have a current medical exam for diving signed by a physician.
- Have logged at least 40 open water dives.
- Be certified at least at the Advanced Open Water Diver level.
- Have Diver Stress and Rescue certification or equivalent, Nitrox and Equipment Techniques.
- Have logged experience in Navigation, Night Diving, Deep Diving, and Search and Recovery.
- Have personal scuba diving equipment of leadership quality.

REQUIREMENTS

- Have current certification in CPR, First Aid and oxygen provider.
- Serve apprenticeship time and perform practice teaching as listed in the course curriculum
- Have logged a total of at least 75 open water dives

TRAINING

The DiveCon Training program consists of about 80 hours of classroom theory, practice teaching presentations, observations, water work in pool and open water, and examination. Instructor Evaluator or Certifier.

AFTER GRADUATION

After certification, active Dive Control Specialists may:

- Conduct Scuba Skills Update and Try Scuba (pool only) programs.
- Conduct limited Specialty training and issue certification.
- Teach snorkel diving and issue certification.
- Teach Scuba Ranger Programs.
- Give underwater tours and serve as dive masters to certified scuba divers.
- Assist active SSI Instructors in academic, pool and open water training.
- Teach the Open Water Diver academic and pool sessions under direct supervision of an active SSI Instructor.
- Take students, no more than two at a time, on underwater tours after the students have successfully completed the required skills in open water scuba dive #2. This must be done under the indirect supervision of an active SSI Instructor.
- Assist students, both in and out of the water, under the supervision of an active SSI Instructor.
- Act as a certified assistant.
- Attend an SSI Instructor Training Course.

CAN NOT DO

Dive Control Specialists may **not**:

- Teach Open Water Diver open water scuba diving without the direct control of an active SSI Instructor.
- Conduct student open water skill evaluations or practice exercises involving any self aid or emergency skills that are done underwater using scuba equipment.
- Issue Open Water Diver scuba certification.

ACTIVE STATUS

To maintain active status, a DiveCon must be affiliated with an SSI Dealer and have current insurance.

COST

Your fee of **\$915** includes:

- Academic instruction
- Confined water instruction
- Open water instruction
- SSI registration and documentation
- Apprenticeship time
- DiveCon manual (\$250.00 Value)
- Liability insurance to your first renewal

Fee does not include:

- Equipment (with the exception of tanks and weights).
- Transportation to activities other than confined water.
- Lodging for open water activities.
