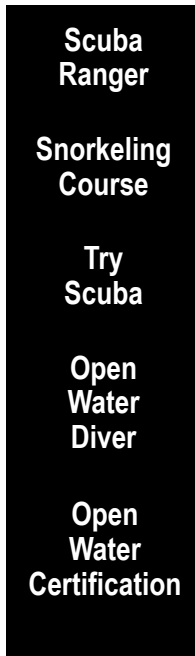

STRESS & RESCUE

Improve your diving confidence, enjoyment and safety with the Stress & Rescue Diver course by Scuba Schools International (SSI). Learn to recognize situations that lead to problems, prevent accidents and handle situations when they do arise. You'll become a better diver and buddy.

REQUIREMENTS

To participate in the Stress & Rescue Diver course, you must:

- Be at least 14 years old.
- Be certified as an Open Water Diver or Junior Open Water Diver or equivalent.
- Have logged at least 12 dives.
- Have dive experience within the past 1 year.
- Complete the home-study academic portion of training. Fill out the study guide questions.
- Complete and sign a confidential medical questionnaire. If certain medical conditions exist, you must have a signature from a physician.

TRAINING

The Stress & Rescue Diver course is a 3-step process:

1. Study academics at home at your convenience. Review the text, watch the video, and complete the study guide.
2. Complete academic review in the classroom and pool sessions with your SSI instructor.
3. Complete open water dives. Apply your skills during 2 open water training sessions.



OPTION A: Complete Course Package

Option A bundles all of the components of the Stress & Rescue Diver course into one package. Option A includes:

- Stress & Rescue Diver course academic training
- Stress & Rescue Diver course confined water training
- CPR/First Aid course with certification**
- Oxygen Provider course with certification**
- Stress & Rescue Diver course open water training scenarios

* Proof of current CPR /First Aid & Oxygen Provider certifications are required to complete the course.

Owning your own equipment will reduce stress and minimize the chance of a diving accident.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Your course fee includes:

- Academic sessions
- Confined water training
- 2 days of diving scenarios
- Air tanks and weights
- Use of appropriate wetsuit for open water
- Certification card upon completion of course
- Two nights lodging based on double occupancy

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED

Your course fee does **not** include:

- Local parking permits
- Santa Rosa dive fee for Blue Hole entry
- Student training packet
- Scuba equipment except as defined above
- Gloves & hood
- Compass, slates, and reel w/ at least 75ft. of line
- Transportation
- Meals
